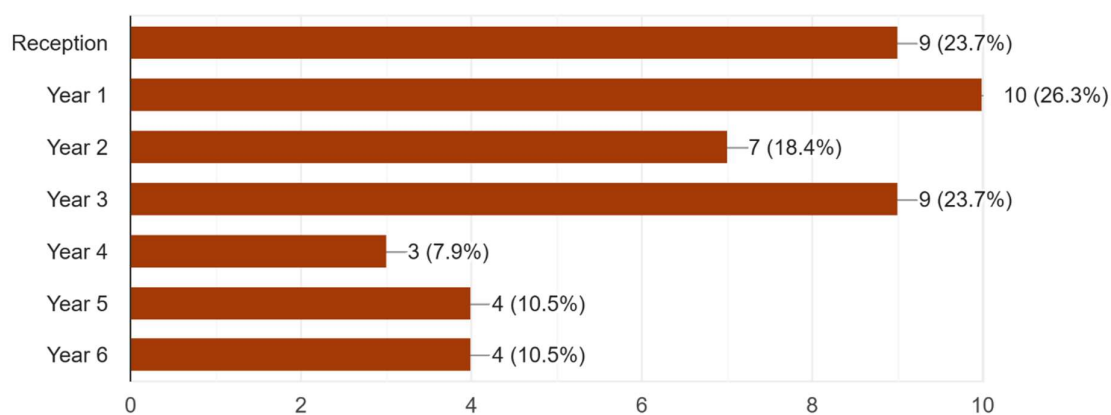

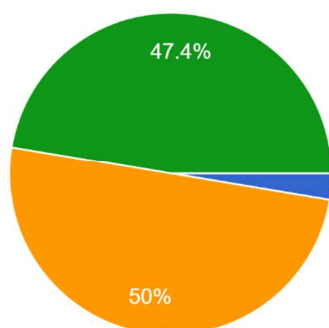
Please select which classes your child/children are in

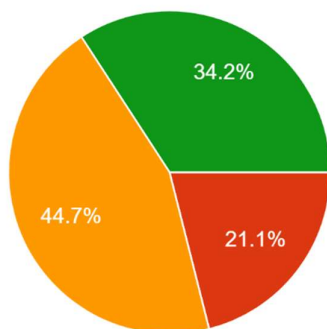

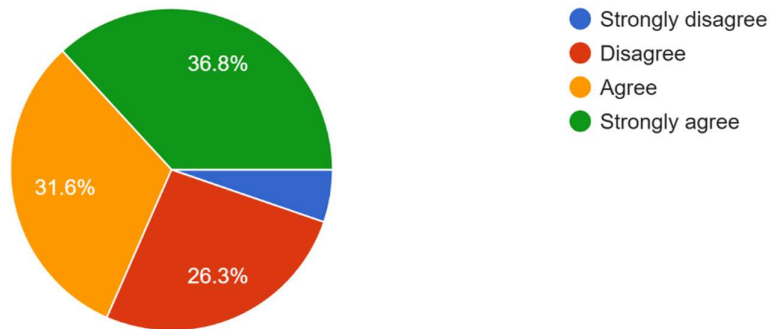

My child(ren) enjoy reading independently at home.

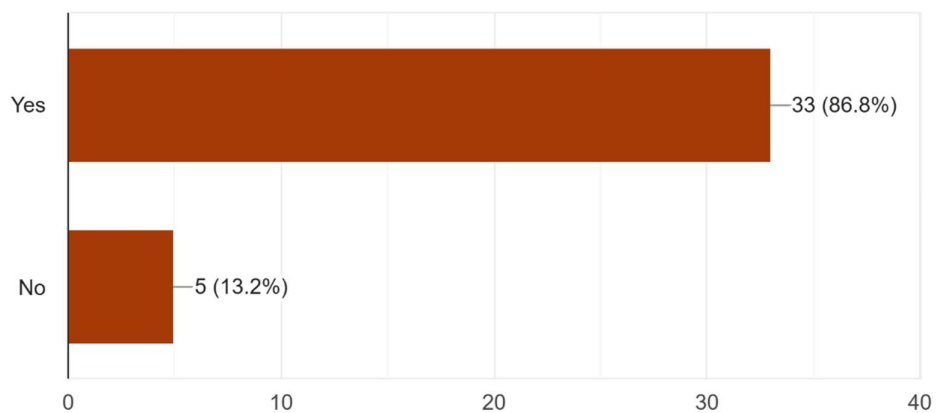

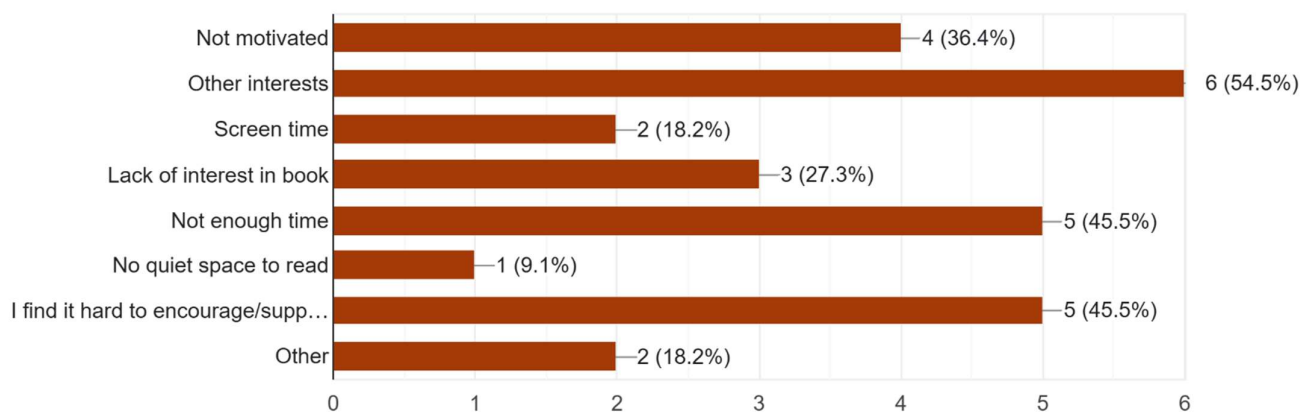
My child(ren) read regularly at home (3 or more times a week)

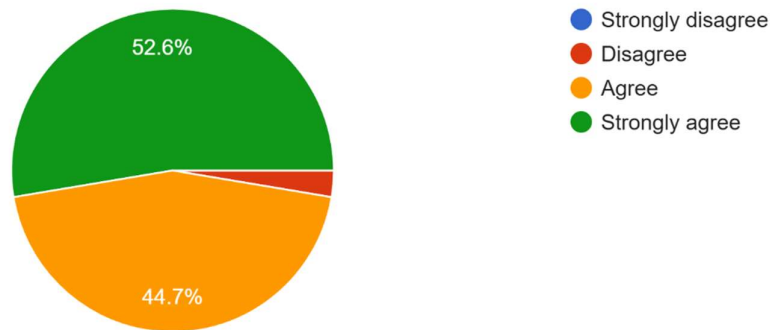

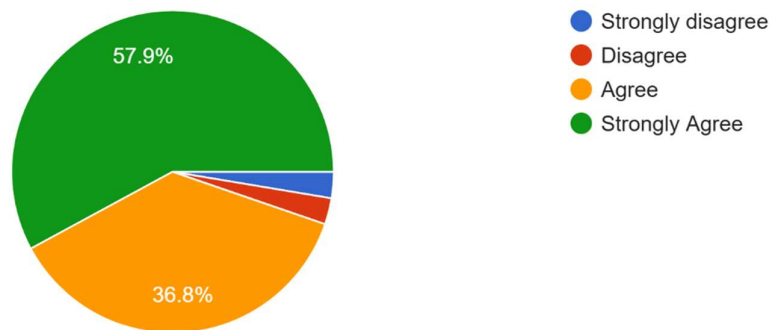

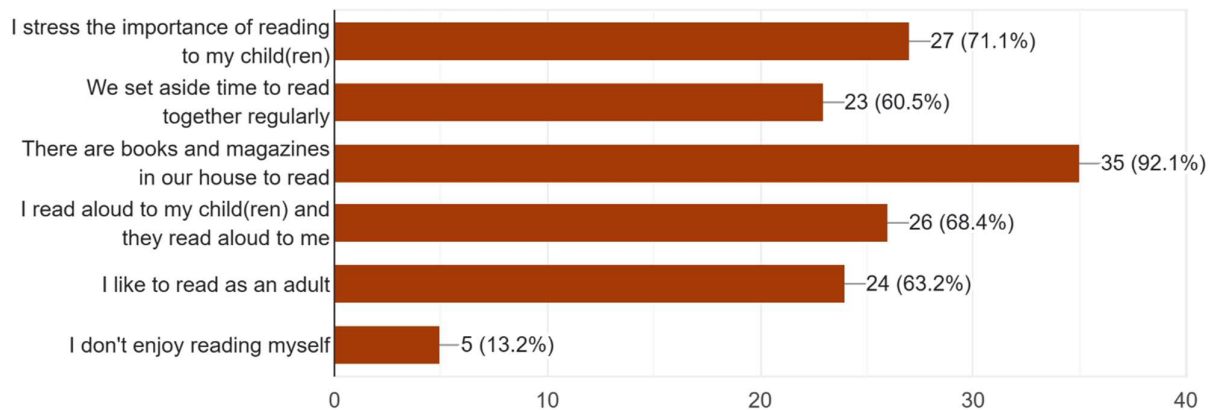

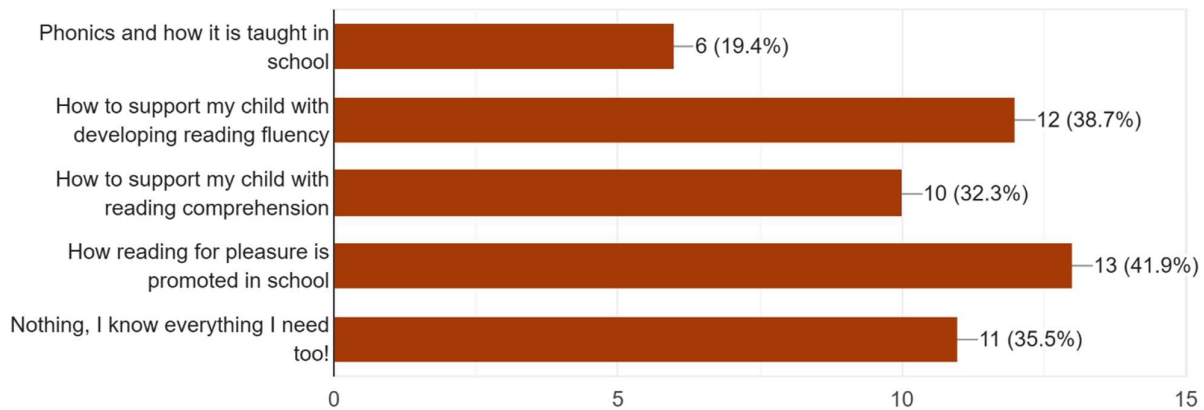

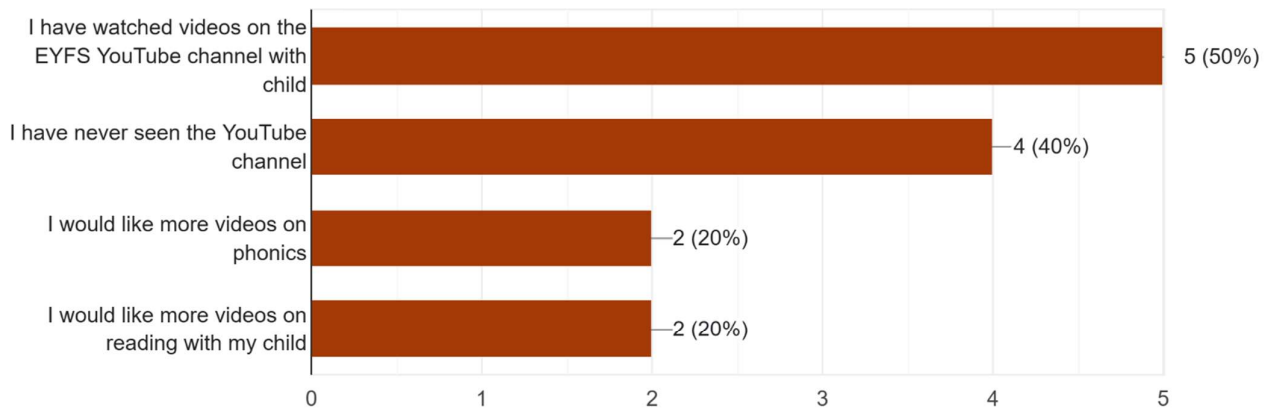

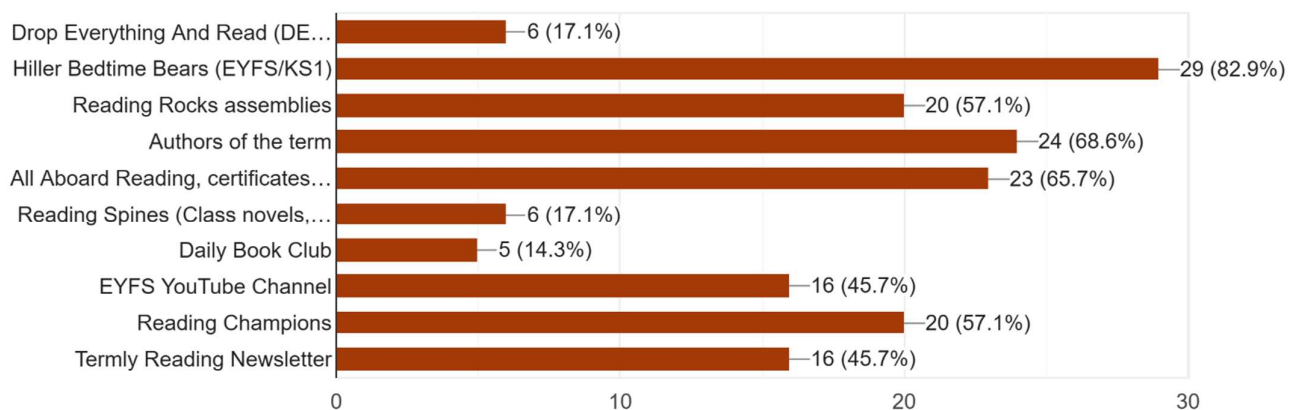

I would like to see more non-fiction books at school as they can contain short bursts of information. We often discuss topics read about to help with a deeper level of understanding when reading a particular section/chapter.	The library and class libraries are full of non-fiction books, which children are free to read and take home as their library book at any time. We also have an agreed non-fiction reading spine, which supports the curriculum covered in classes. This can be viewed on our school website.
Between homework, reading at least 3 times a week and home learning tasks it's very hard to try to get them all done. I think something needs to give as it's a lot for the children when they have done a full day at school	We appreciate that family life is very full! Reading should be something to encourage for fun, downtime and enjoyment and not a chore. If you would like more support with this or if you are struggling with any aspect of homework/home learning being sent home, please talk to class teachers.

A few years ago, we trialled an app where parents could record when their child read at home. Is this something that you could look into again?	We did trial an app for recording reading a few years ago, and whilst staff really found it useful, general feedback from parents was not very positive and unfortunately, it didn't help to improve the numbers of children reading at home and recording their reading.
