The school will to its best to: ➤ Support your child's wellbeing and safety by providing a safe, supportive and caring environment ➤ Help and encourage your child to reach their full potential ➤ Monitor and communicate with parents and carers regularly on your child's progress ➤ Provide a broad and balanced curriculum that caters for all children, including when delivered remotely ➤ Promote high standards of behaviour so we can maintain a safe environment for all children ➤ Offer your child opportunities to develop a sense of responsibility, form healthy social relationships and build their self-esteem ➤ Set homework that supports the delivery of the curriculum and mark it where appropriate ➤ Offer opportunities for parents and carers to get involved in school life ➤ Communicate between home and school through text messages, emails, Facebook, newsletters and the school website ➤ Respond to communications from parents in a timely manner, following school policies ➤ Encourage good attendance and address any concerns with parents or carers where necessary ➤ Celebrate and encourage the school 'PREACH' values and British Values to prepare children for life in modern Britain.	Parents / Carers will do their best to: ➤ Make sure my child attends school regularly and on time - 8.50am. I will notify the school each day of my child's absence. ➤ Fully support the school's Attendance policy. Avoid taking holidays or days out in term time. Seek authority from the Headteacher for any absences. ➤ Make sure my child is dressed in the correct uniform – including school PE kit on PE days ➤ Support the school to make sure my child maintains a consistently high standard of behaviour ➤ Encourage my child to try their best so they can reach their full potential ➤ Communicate to the school any concerns that I have about my child that may affect their behaviour in school or ability to learn ➤ Make sure communication with the school is respectful, and that I make every reasonable effort to address my communications to the appropriate member of staff ➤ Understand that I should communicate with staff during core school hours, and although they may at times respond outside of those hours, I can't always expect that ➤ Make sure that my child completes their homework on time, and raise any issues that my child has with their teachers ➤ Support my child's reading by hearing them read a minimum of 3 times a week ➤ Read and follow the school's policies including Attendance, Behaviour and Parent Conduct ➤ Treat all members of the school community with care and respect ➤ Ensure that no negative, personal or adverse comments about children, staff or the school are posted on any social networks or websites including Facebook. ➤ Engage in parent meetings and work together with the school in order to achieve the best outcomes for my child ➤ Read all communications sent home by the school and respond where necessary	I will do my best to: ➤ Arrive at school on time and ready to learn ➤ Try my best to do my work and ask for help if I need it ➤ Wear the correct school uniform – including PE kit on PE days ➤ Bring all the equipment I need each day ➤ Be respectful, friendly and caring towards other children and adults ➤ Listen to instructions from the adults at school and follow the school rules ➤ Be a good role model to others and demonstrate the school's PREACH values ➤ Do my homework and bring it back to school on time ➤ Read at home at least 3 times a week ➤ Look after the school equipment and be respectful of the school environment
