This week sees the first of our Star-books reading celebration afternoons!

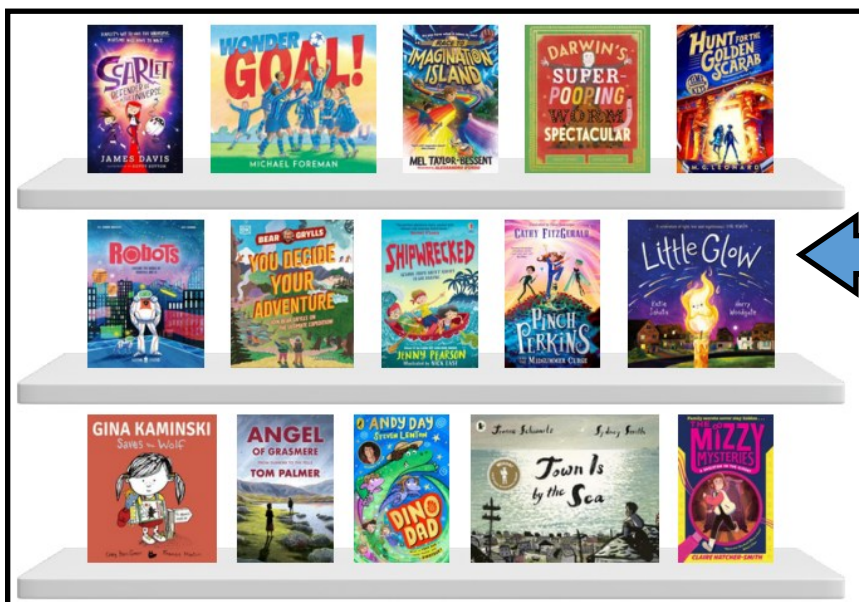
Each term, class teams will nominate children who have truly impressed staff with their reading—whether through consistent reading at home, enthusiastic participation in class, or a growing love for books.
