- Speaking and listening in a range of situations – presentational talk
- Enjoy rhyming songs and stories.
- Speaking in clear sentences and linking ideas.
- Listening games – listening to instructions with 2 or 3 parts
- Give instructions to make a boat
- Recount stories and learn to tell stories

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Jigsaw sessions – relationships – building friendships and playing by the rules, Moving on – preparing for transition.
- Feelings focus – weekly
- Outdoor play – how do we play outside?
- Regulating self – what can we do?
- Mindfulness and yoga sessions to encourage self-reg
- Concentrating for a sustained period of time
- Being proud of achievements and progress

- Small world play – castle, pirate ship, farm
- Use ipads to make pirate pictures
- Use 2paint to create drawings of plants
- Make boats
