Omnivores - Animals that eat meat and plants

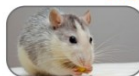


Vertebrate Animal Classes

- Lives on land and water



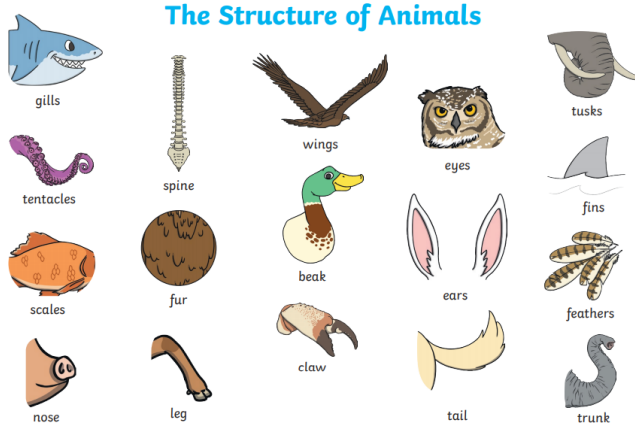

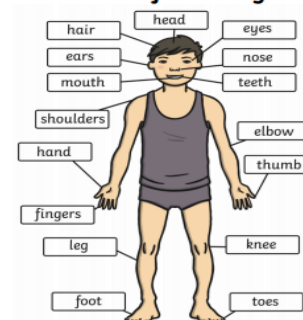
Vital Vocabulary

Cold blooded	A body temperature that changes to the temperature around it.
Warm blooded	A body temperature which is high and doesn't change to the temperature around it.
Human	A person; human being. Humans are part of the class of mammal.
Body	The main part of a person or animal.
Vertebrate	Animal with a backbone.
Senses	The way all animals understand the experiences around them.
